Classroom Behavior:

Respect is the most important concept in the classroom! I expect all students to be respectful in the classroom.

1. Do raise your hand before you talk.
2. Do listen to others in a discussion and reserve comments that are inappropriate or intended to make a student look wrong for their point of view.
3. Do stop talking and stay seated when the teacher is talking.
4. Do take responsibility for your choice or actions.
5. Do avoid judgemental behavior.



Realize that people learn differently. Patience and understanding is vital.

Respect Basic Classroom Rules:

1. Students may not leave the room without a hall pass. The hall pass must be attached to the agenda. Students are discouraged from asking to leave the room ten minutes after or before the bell rings.
2. Students may not eat or drink in the classroom. If you eat or drink in the classroom you will be asked to throw away the food or drink. Be prepared if you choose to ignore the no eating or drinking rule to discard the food or receive a disciplinary action.
3. Students may not attempt to play practical jokes or disrupt other students during instructional time.
4. Students must be seated when the bell rings. Students out of their seat socializing or in the hall will be marked tardy if they are not in their seats. Tardiness will result in a daily participation grade reduction.



Be Responsible for your Grade:

Turn in homework on time.

1. Upon entering class. **IF** you don't turn in your work on time, but you still want to turn it in you must turn it in at the end of the day.
2. Other than the one option listed; I will not accept late work.

If a student works on homework during class it will be taken away and no credit will be given. If a student works on an assignment for another class the assignment will be taken from the student and returned to the teacher whom assigned the work.

IF you work on a computer:

1. **ALWAYS** have a back-up copy and/or hard copy of your work. (I recommend backing up on the hard drive and a jump drive. If you have the ability to make your work a PDF document you can print it from any computer, anywhere.)
2. **I WILL NOT** accept the excuse your computer froze or the printer ran out of ink. If you must copy it from the screen.
