Dear Parent:

This letter is to inform you that Baker County School District has been identified as a district in need of corrective action based on the federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act. This means that the district did not meet all state student achievement criteria, or Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP), in reading, writing, and/or mathematics for four or more years. The Baker County School District met 87 percent of the AYP criteria.

The Florida Department of Education requires your school district to develop a plan to improve the achievement of its schools. In addition, the district must move some of its funds to the schools to support activities that improve student achievement.

- Participating in activities at the school
- Becoming a member of the School Advisory Council
- Volunteering at your child's school
