



Video audio track

- Videos often have an attached audio track
- When you trim the video track the audio track is trimmed along with it
- Adjust the audio level by selecting the *Set Audio Levels* button, the farthest left button just above the timeline
- You can adjust the audio level between Video/Audio track and Audio/Music track

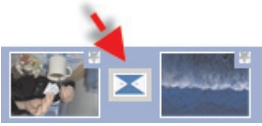


- Select *Video Effects* from the Movie Task pane
- Icons will be displayed for the various effects available
- Drag an effect to a clip in the storyboard or timeline
- A star will display in the lower left corner of the clip to indicate an effect has been applied



Video effects

- Select *View Video Transitions* from the Movie Task pane
- Icons will be displayed for the various transitions available
- Drag the transition to the small rectangle between two clips in the storyboard view
- Placing transitions is easily accomplished in storyboard mode



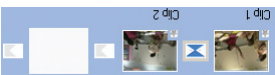
Transitions

- Press the *Play button* just above the storyboard, timeline, or under the preview window
- If one clip is selected in the storyboard then only that clip will play
- To view the entire movie make sure no clips are selected before you press the play button.

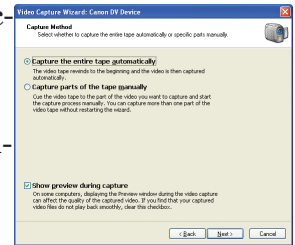


Previewing

- If you do not want to use the total clip then see Editing Clips below
- If you do not see rectangular boxes across the bottom of the window then you are in the Timeline view. Press the *Show Storyboard* button just above the timeline to change the view.
- Arrange your clips in the storyboard by dragging to rearrange them
- To remove a clip from the Storyboard, right-click on it and select delete.
- Select the video clip you want to place into your movie
- Drag the clip to one of the rectangular boxes in the storyboard

- Notice in the Video file size section of the window it tells you
 - Amount of disk space per minute of video capture
 - Amount of disk space available on your computer
- Select *Next*
- You can capture the entire video or manually select parts of the video



Capturing from DV tape

- Under the preview window are controls that allow you to play, stop, pause, fast-forward, rewind, forward one frame, or reverse one frame
- The tape position indicator tells you the current location of the tape in Hours, Minutes, Seconds, and Percents of a second
- When the tape is in position click *Start Capture*
- When the tape reaches the end of the selection you want to capture, click *Stop Capture*
- This creates a video clip for use in your project
- Locate the beginning of the next selection and repeat the process
- When finished capturing, click *Finish*

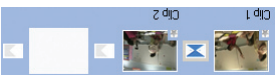
Transitions

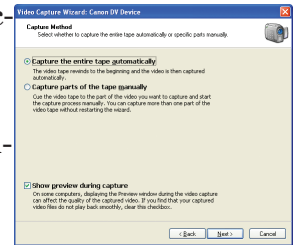


Previewing
