

Red Rocks Community College Credit at your High School

Red Rocks Community College (RRCC) is pleased to offer Academic and Career based Jefferson County high school and WarrenTech classes for college credit that is taught in the high school classroom.

The credit earned is for dual enrollment – college credit and high school credit toward graduation requirements and it's FREE! If the course is successfully completed with a grade of "C" or higher, Jefferson County Public Schools will pay the tuition and college credit will be granted.

If you are enrolled in a class that is eligible to receive RRCC credit, please follow the steps below to get started.

- Complete the FREE online applications for Red Rocks Community College and College Opportunity Fund** online at www.rrcc.edu/admis

You will need:

- Your Social Security Number
- Colorado Driver's License or ID for you and your parent
- Residency information from your parent or legal guardian
- A signature from your parent if you are under 18 years old
- Be sure to click "YES" to create the College Opportunity Fund Application on your behalf.



- Complete Academic Assessment** – All students are required to take the Accuplacer Assessment test or provide ACT or SAT scores before registration. *Some Academic classes that offer college credit require a specific ACT, SAT or Accuplacer Assessment Test score-see chart on reverse side.

Assessment can be accomplished by:

- Turning in your ACT or SAT scores. Please refer to the list of required scores on the reverse side

- Taking the free Accuplacer Assessment Test at Red Rocks Community College
 - Testing is offered on a walk-in basis at the Lakewood or Arvada Campus
 - The Accuplacer takes approximately 90 minutes
 - The Accuplacer covers Math, English and Reading
 - You must complete the FREE Red Rocks Application before testing
 - You will need to present a photo ID in order to test

- A signature from you, your high school teacher, and your parent or legal guardian

You will need:

- Your State Assigned Student Identifier (SASID) Number in Section A (provided by high school)
- A signature from you and your parent or legal guardian in section B
- A signature from the high school principal (if not provided) in Section D
