OBJECTIVES

1. THE STUDENT WILL PRACTICE THE SKILLS OF CAMERA OPERATION BY PROPERLY EXPOSING A ROLL OF FILM
2. THE STUDENT WILL DEMONSTRATE PROPER FILM DEVELOPING TECHNIQUES BY CORRECTLY PROCESSING THIS ROLL OF FILM.

SPECS

1. USE 1 ROLL OF ASA 400 SPEED B & W FILM, NON C-41 PROCESS.
2. USING YOUR CAMERA WITH A BUILT IN LIGHT METER, SET THE METER ASA AT 400.
3. SHOOT HALF THE ROLL **INDOORS**.
 - A. USING SHUTTER PRIORITY, FIRST SET YOUR SHUTTER SPEED AT 1/25 AND THEN SET YOUR F-STOP AT WHATEVER YOUR METER TELLS YOU.
4. SHOOT HALF THE ROLL **OUTDOORS**.
 - A. USING SHUTTER PRIORITY, FIRST SET YOUR SHUTTER SPEED AT 1/500 AND THEN SET YOUR F-STOP AT WHATEVER YOUR METER TELLS YOU.
5. SUBJECT MATTER IS ENTIRELY UP TO THE STUDENT **WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THOSE DISCUSSED IN CLASS**.

FILM PROCESSING

1. FILM WILL BE PROCESSED NORMALLY USING RODINAL 1:25 DEVELOPER WITH TIMES AND TEMPERATURES TO BE DETERMINED ACCORDING TO FILM PROCESSING CHARTS.

MINIMUM LEVEL OF ACCEPTANCE

OF 12 NEGATIVES SUBMITTED FOR A GRADE, AT LEAST 9 OF THEM MUST BE:

1. IN FOCUS
2. PROPERLY EXPOSED. UNDER OR OVER EXPOSED NEGATIVES ARE UNACCEPTABLE.
3. DEVELOPED PROPERLY WITH NO CHEMICAL STAINS OR BURNS.
