Children must read 6 books.

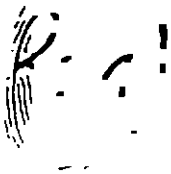
Prizes will be awarded to participants along the way.

Family Reading Poster

Make reading a family adventure and share what you have read with others by making a Family Reading Poster! These are just some suggestions, be creative.

- ❖ Any size paper will do! Any color paper is fine.
- ❖ Make it a collage. Clip out or cut pictures from magazines, draw pictures from scenes from the book, ideas which represent characters.
- ❖ Draw an important moment from the book, draw a character, draw a scene, color it or keep it black and white. These are your ideas - it's your poster!
- ❖ Make the poster into an advertisement for the book or even imagine the book was made into a movie.
- ❖ Make the poster look like the cover of the book.
- ❖ Research - Write About It - Share information about the author and the book.
